Roman Festival

Aim: to integrate the study of great civilizations, dramatic art, fine art, writing, cooking, vocabulary enrichment, geography, and community development

Materials: Donated fabric supplies and food, large poster board, construction paper, and general classroom art and office supplies. Specialty items can be donated as needed.

Key Points:

- Students create an immersive experience. They learn about a great civilization through multiple learning modalities.
- Student committees develop: edible, dramatic, visual, architectural, musical, and physical experiences from a great civilization for the enjoyment of guests.
- Vocabulary enrichment: historical terms from the ancient world.
- Other classes attend the festival as guests.
- Create shared experience.
- Build community through group work.

Extension:

- Separate classrooms can each do a different civilization.
- Parents could be invited as guests.
- Students could create the festival in a multipurpose room to enter a separate "world".
